The last **transnational project meeting** took place in Krakow (Poland) on 19th-20th September.

The goal of the gathering was to review all completed tasks and discuss on what needs to be done before the very end of the SNAIL project and the submission of the final report.

During these days, the partners gave an **overview** of what has been created for the project over the past two years. Special emphasis was put on the latest output and its translation. It was agreed that the last month as well as the next years would be dedicated to promotion and **dissemination of the resources** created.

Finally, a brainstorming session took place with possible project ideas to which the **SNAIL philosophy** could be applied. We believe that the "slow movement" fits into many current relevant fields and that it is worthwhile to further explore this trend.





Final steps

Partners consortium had so far finished the three project results and are now focusing on the translation of the last one, called **SLOW TRAINING**, a manual for coaches, trainers and facilitators to implement the SNAIL training system in companies.

The latter will host the videos created by each partner to explain the tools that make up the manual for trainers.
